
the service we provide to our patients and family members. I cannot imagine another hospital in this nation that could match our level of volunteerism.

Curb-Waste Program

100-DAY WORKOUT PROGRAM



All departments of the Hospital, including the Volunteer Office, are involved in a new initiative to save time, energy and money, through Caldwell Butler's 100-Day Workout program. The Director of each department initiates two programs each month to curb waste. Aimee Yahn-Carmichael, our Director, had already begun a waste-curbing program, prior to the initiative, pushing her ahead the initiative's timeline.

Boca Regional Introduces Web-Based Patient Portal

Patients of Boca Raton Regional Hospital now have a convenient, easily accessible and secure way to electronically access a host of personal medical data.

Patient Connect, a portal located on the Boca Regional website, provides an entry point for patients to review their medical visits or treatment, see summaries of inpatient stays and be able to monitor lab and radiology reports.

"We feel that this new resource will help us engage our patients in a meaningful way and provide them with a valuable resource in managing their particular healthcare needs or situation," said Robin Hildwein, Chief Information Officer and Executive Director of Information Services at Boca Raton Regional Hospital. "By offering information in this fashion, we strengthen the partnership that is so vital to a productive patient-provider relationship."

Patient Connect also allows for a patient to designate a caregiver, such as a husband or wife, to also have access to the individual's available medical information. A recent national study revealed that 29 percent of adults in the United States are considered caregivers for another person. Thirty-one percent of all households in America contain a caregiver. Given these data, a technology like Patient Connect can serve as a vital resource for these individuals and ease such burdens as tracking and maintaining discharge instructions or being appraised of test reports.

"We urge patients to take advantage of Patient Connect," said Ms. Hildwein. "We are confident they will find it to be a most responsive and reliable source of information for them."


