A

ACKNOWLEDGE

Greet the patient by name. Make eye contact, smile and acknowledge family or friends in the room.

I

INTRODUCE

Introduce yourself with your name, skill set, professional certification and experience.

D

DURATION

Give an accurate time expectation for tests, physician arrival and identify next steps. When this is not possible, give a time in which you will update the patient on progress.

E

EXPLANATION

Clarify step-by-step what to expect next, answer questions and let the patient know how to contact you, such as a nurse call button.

T

THANK YOU

You might express gratitude to the patient and/or family for choosing Boca Regional or for their communication and cooperation. Thank family members for being there to support the patient.
